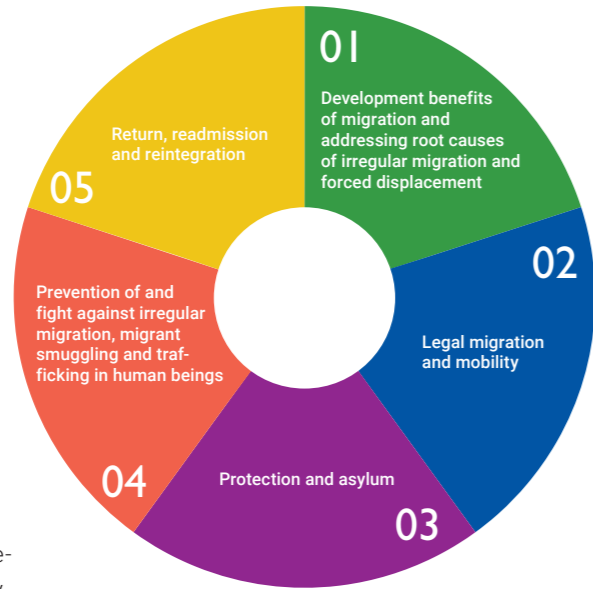


BACKGROUND

The 2015 Valletta Summit on Migration brought together European and African leaders to strengthen cooperation between the two continents.

Participating states and organisations adopted the Joint Valletta Action Plan (JVAP) in a spirit of solidarity, partnership and shared responsibility. The JVAP became the Europe-Africa framework to address migration policy. It is built around **five domains**.



The five domains of the JVAP

The Khartoum and the Rabat Processes were mandated to follow-up on the implementation of the JVAP, thereby making their respective participating states, and organisations, JVAP Partners. JVAP Partners (also called Focal Points) involved in the JVAP Follow-up are:

- **African institutions:** AUC
- **European institutions and agencies:** EC, Council of the EU, EEAS, FRONTEX
- **Regional organisations:** ECOWAS, IGAD
- **International organisations:** IOM, ILO, UNDP, UNHCR, UNODC
- **African States**
- **European States**

A Database was established to track progress, and document related projects and policies. A Data Visualisation Tool (DVT) connected to the Database supports the Partners with provision of up-to-date data analysis and graphics, which contributes to the discussions of the respective Dialogues.

ICMPD facilitates the JVAP Follow-up process through the *Support Programme to the Africa-EU Migration and Mobility Dialogue (MMD)*, funded by the European Union, in the framework of the Joint Africa-EU Strategy and through the Pan-African Programme.



TOOLS

I. DATA COLLECTION

A new data collection cycle is initiated: Focal Points collect data internally and report it on a voluntary basis.

2. DATA ENTRY AND CHECK

Focal Points report initiatives to the JVAP Follow-up which are then checked for accuracy and validity.

THE PORTAL

- provides information to the migration policy community and broader public
- serves as gateway to the Database and the Data Visualisation Tool
- provides Partners with access to materials and resources designed to assist them with the data collection cycle

THE DATABASE

Hosts initiatives (projects and policies):

- undertaken since 2015
- implemented in the Khartoum Rabat Process regions
- funded or sponsored by JVAP Partners
- covering the five domains and 105 priorities of the JVAP

THE DATA VISUALISATION TOOL

- updated in real-time by the Database
- provides Partners the opportunity to view the data contained in the Database
- provides actionable knowledge in the form of dynamic data visualisations intended to support evidence-based decision-making

4. DATA-DRIVEN MIGRATION POLICY

The data collected helps track progress against the implementation of the JVAP, and this in turn substantiates reports, and contributes to the Dialogues' discussions.

3. DATA VISUALS AND ANALYSIS

The data is extracted, organised, and made available online to all JVAP Partners.

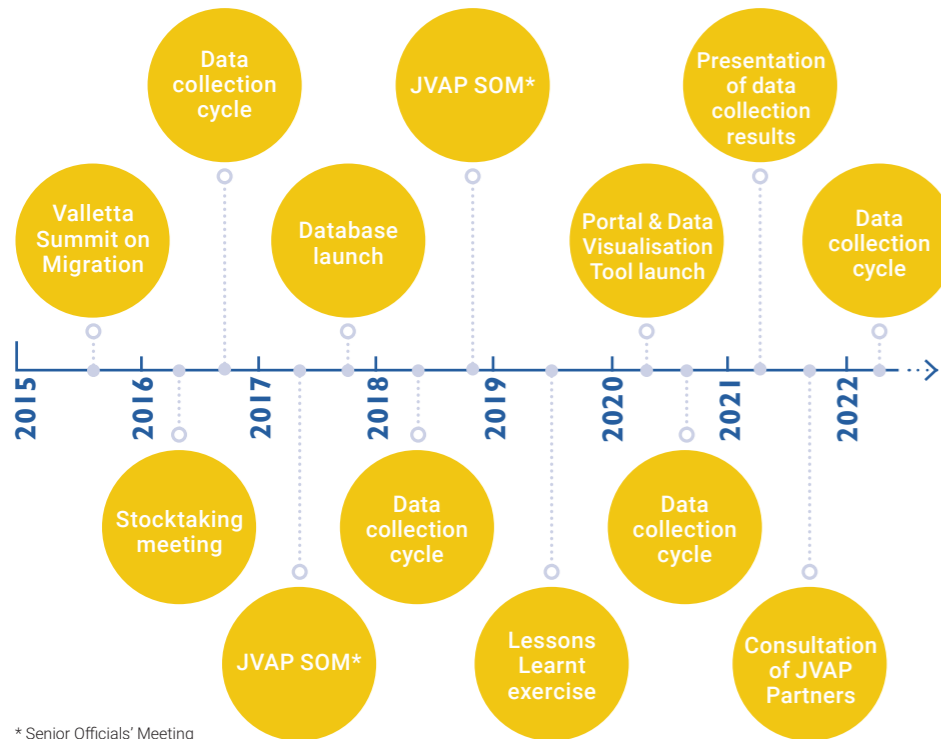
